Order dated 5th February, 2025

Today this matter has appeared in the list to extend the period of bail. It appears on 12.11.2024 another Division Bench enlarged the petitioner on ad-interim anticipatory bail for a period of 4(four) weeks or till submission of the police report whichever is earlier on furnishing bail bond subject to the satisfaction of the learned Chief Metropolitan Magistrate, Dhaka. Subsequently, on 12.12.2024 the

period of bail was extended for a further period of 8(eight) weeks.

The learned Advocate for the petitioner bring notice to this Court that the police report has not yet been submitted but the period of bail granted earlier will expire on 06.02.2025. Thus, he sought extension.

It is noted that on an application under section 498 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, this Court issued Rule and granted ad-interim anticipatory bail, police report has not yet been submitted. There is no allegation against the petitioner relates with the misuse of privilege of bail. Therefore, accused petitioner deserved extension.

Thus, the ad-interim anticipatory bail which has been granted earlier is hereby extended till submission of the police report from date.

In the result, the Rule is disposed of.
